TREASURER'S REPORT / BOB BOUCK As of 8/31/92, the balance in the Water Association fund was \$27,068.56 and the Homeowners Association \$5,706.61.

SECRETARY'S REPORT/SOCIAL ACTIVITIES / ANNETTE HANCOCK

WATER REPORT / MIKE CUNNINGHAM
The Farnsworth & Wylie report was discussed and is available for any residents to review. The Board voted at the September meeting to go ahead with the maintenance repairs recommended for the water tower. The water will need to be shut down for a while and we will be under a boil order. A second well and gas chlorination was also discussed.

GROUNDS REPORT / BILL ROE

HOMEOWNER'S SURVEY / DOUG REEVES
We had 58 households respond to the Homeowner's Survey.
A summary of the survey will be sent to all residents in the next water bill and a meeting will be set up in November.


MICROWAVE CABLE / DOUG REEVES

INDIAN CREEK SUBDIVISION Special Meeting Minutes November 16, 1992

Approximately 25 families attended the special meeting at the Towarda Town Hall on Monday, November 16th, 1992 to discuss the Homeowner's Survey. The following items were discussed:

Entrances to Subdivision Need was expressed in survey for better lighting and signs at the subdivision entrances or a possible speed limit reduction on Route 29. An easement would be needed from the homeowners for signs to be placed on their lots. Corn Belt Electric can install a self-metered street light at minimum cost. The County could be asked to do a study on the amount of traffic on Route 29 at our entrances. The Board will explore these possibilities.

Common Area A motion was made and approved for the Board to investigate but not pursue the costs of a playground, basketball court, baseball backstop, or a shelter for the common area and research the zoning restrictions and liability insurance for these improvements and report at the Annual Meeting.

Motorized Vehicles The survey indicated concerns over the use of 4-wheelers in the areas of safety, liability, legality of use, noise, and preservation of nature.

A motion was made and defeated to discontinue use of all motorized vehicles on the common area until a policy is presented and accepted by a majority vote of all homeowners. A motion was made and not seconded to authorize motorized vehicles in the common area behind the water tower for property owners only. Since nothing was resolved on this issue, it was suggested that problems be discussed directly with the individuals involved.

Water System
Mike Cunningham discussed the Farnsworth and Wylie Report
on our water system and passed around copies for everyone's
review. This report recommended water meters based on our
water usage from November 1991 through June 1992. The
safe long term yield (per IEPA) of 35 GPM or 50,400 GPD
(gallons per day) was exceeded on many days during the
drought periods in May and June of 1992. Our usage of
87,500 gallons pumped on May 19th pumped the tower dry
which caused low pressure resulting in a boil order
and water restrictions.

A motion was made and passed at the meeting to install water meters as soon as physically possible in Indian Creek Subdivision with co-payment by Homeowners and the Water Association. A second motion was made and passed assuming the first motion passes, the Indian Creek Subdivision water Association will pay up to 40% of current funds not to exceed \$11,000 to purchase the physical supplies/meters for all lots with the individual homeowners to cover the remaining cost of installing water meters. Both motions passed favored by a majority of the votes cast at the meeting. However, our covenants require a majority of all members to take action. Therefore, members not present at the meeting can vote in writing within 10 days after the meeting. A written vote was sent to all homeowners on the following day. Assuming the vote passed, the Board will provide the rate structure for water billing to be approved at the Annual Meeting.

<u>Enforcement of Covenants</u> The survey indicated concerns over covenant violations.
These will need to be discussed at a later meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:12 P.M.
