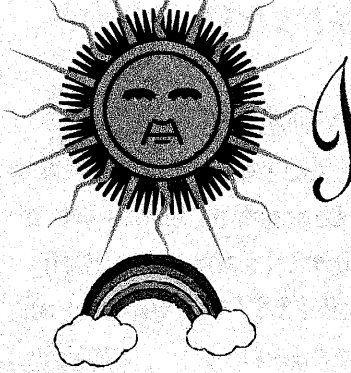

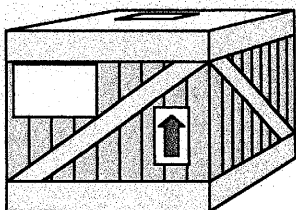
The Fahling Family has inherited a very nice grill cover from one of the storms and bouts of wind we have recently had.

WILD ANIMAL CONCERN

A raccoon was observed in the Lamplighter Subdivision last week that was lethargic, unafraid of people or other animals and laying around in the open. A family called several agencies which finally resulted in Paul Kelly of Hudson removing the animal (for a fee) which was tested and put to sleep.

It was learned that 10-20 wild animals in the El Paso area have been identified with distemper in recent weeks.

Please be alert to wild animals exhibiting these symptoms and take precautions with pets and children.

Sightings of such animals should be reported for everyone's safety.
