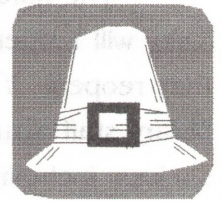

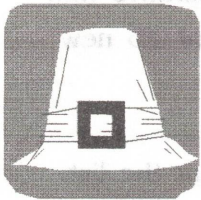
## Editorial



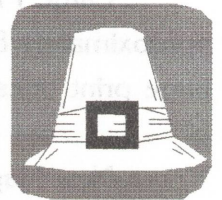
I would like to thank every one of the residents that called this past month and gave me input on the monthly newsletters' importance.



I had no idea if the newsletter was worth the time, effort and money put into it or not and asked for comments about the newsletter itself and how often it should be printed.



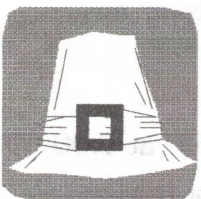

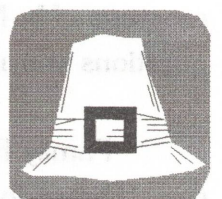
This makes me want to continue doing this for my friends and neighbors with a smile on my face. I am glad I am able to do this for you and will continue as long as the interest is there.

The contest has been canceled and no prizes will be awarded.

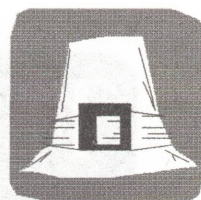
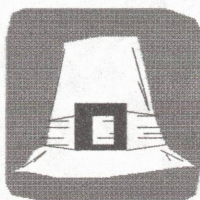


Again, I would like to thank each and every resident that called to let me know their opinion on the newsletter. It was appreciated more than you know!



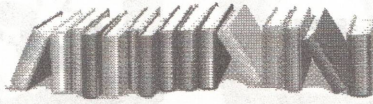

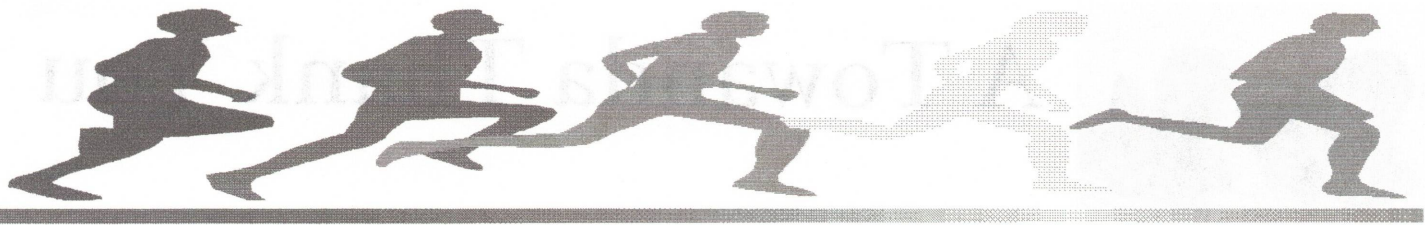

**Kevin Fahling** at 2 Pepperwood Court who finished in 3 hours and 1 minute!

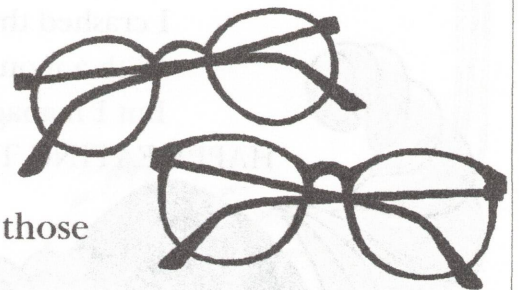
**Sue Arnold** at 15 Candle Ridge Road who finished in 4 hours and 51 minutes!

### October Message!

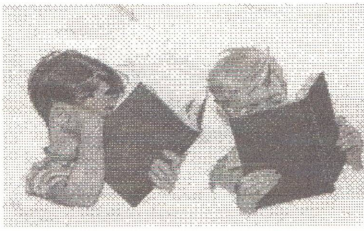
