

Recipes

Baked Pumpkin Seeds: Remove pump & string, then rinse seeds well. Place in a single layer on an ungreased cookie sheet. Preheat oven to 325 degrees and bake for 15-20 minutes or until seeds are dry and light brown. (for crispier seeds bake 25-30 minutes) Salt to taste (also great without salt!) Use as a healthy kid snack or stain with food coloring and use to decorate jack-o-lanterns, costumes, other treats. Your imagination is your only limit!

Busy Bugs: Melt 1 package of chocolate chips and 1 package of butterscotch chips in double boiler or microwave and pour over 1 large can of chow mein noodles and 1-1/2 cups of peanuts. Mix well and drop by spoonfuls on ungreased cookie sheet. Chill until firm. Look like spiders to you?????

Costumes





This cake does not need frosting and tastes yummy.




Need a Pet?
