Early voting is "no excuse needed" absentee voting. It will be available at the McLean County Clerk's office and additional satellite offices.


#### **Absentee Voting:**

# Electronics-Recycling Program in Normal

Ever wonder how to recycling those no-longed needed electronic devices that seem to accumulate in closets, basements, and garages. You can take them to the Electronics Recycling Program in Normal, located near the Public Works Garage at 1301 Warriner St, Normal. They are open 7:00am to 2:00pm Monday through Friday.

All recycled electronic items go to Recycle for Illinois, a not-for-profit group that revamps as many of the products as possible and gives them free to the needy or physically disabled. Some parts are sold to help keep the operation running. Unusable parts are sold to recyclers.

Damaged or nonfunctioning appliances will be accepted, and all donations are tax deductible. Large items like a washer, dryer, refrigerator are not accepted. Items they will take are:
