
Towanda Holiday Party

Indoor Composting – with Worms!

The Ecology Action Center will hold a family-oriented vermicomposting workshop to take place **Thursday**, **December 2**, **2010 at 5:30 p.m.** Vermicomposting, or composting with worms, is an easy way to recycle food scraps into a very usable soil amendment for your lawn, garden, or potted plants. Vermicomposting is a convenient alternative to backyard composting, as it can easily be done in a small space and it works year round, even during the winter.

The workshop will include everything needed to successfully begin vermicomposting - including worms! Various types of compost systems and techniques will be discussed in addition to troubleshooting tips to avoid potential problems. Participants will make and take home a vermicomposting bin ready for use.

Space is limited and pre-registration is required; registration forms are available for download at http://www.ecologyactioncenter.org or by stopping by the Ecology Action Center at 202 W. College in Normal. The cost is \$25.00 per family (includes one composter and set of worms) for EAC members and \$35.00 for non-member families. All family members must be at least 5 years old.
