Annual Homeowner's Meeting

January 19, 2011: 7 pm at the Towanda Community Building

All homeowners are invited to attend the annual meeting. Come find out if anything new is happening in our neighborhood. For example, one of the many questions the board handles is about whom to contact when you need to have your utility lines marked:

When you dig:

Tri-County Locators: 815-973-4568, www.tricountylocators.com/

Effective August 1, 2008, TriCounty will respond to all of the JULIE locate requests for ICWHA initiated when homeowners are planning to dig in their yard. Historically, these locate requests were handled by the ICWHA Water Chair.

The State of Illinois considers ICWHA a municipality since it is a provider of water to its residents. As such, ICWHA is legally required to be a member of JULIE, a cooperative that notifies all potentially impacted JULIE members of locate requests which may affect their assets.

Important Information:

If you need to dig, the homeowner has the responsibility to call JULIE because it is the law. JULIE will notify TriCounty to mark the lines of the water provider, electricity provider, phone, & gas because those conduits are assets owned by their respective vendors. Gas and electric do get marked to the house, but phone and water lines generally do not get marked to the house. Marking the line into the house for water is not part of the fee the Association pays JULIE when a homeowner calls. If the homeowner desires to have the water line mapped between the outside shut-off (curb stop) to their home exclusively, this charge is on the homeowner, not the association (see exception below).

Exception: At the time you are calling JULIE about the dig and you need the shut-off (curb stop) valve and water line into the house marked, you may ask JULIE to include a note to have this done while they are out marking the primary lines. There will be NO additional charge to the homeowner.

<u>Borrow Books from 200+ Libraries:</u> One of the privileges of using a library in Illinois is the fact that you may order books online from any of the surrounding libraries and pick up the books at your own home library. From the Towanda Library homepage, simply select the **RSACat** link on the right-hand side of the page. Find the book you want. Place a HOLD (reserve the book). Within a week your book will arrive via free delivery. We will phone you when the book arrives for you. No hassle! No charge!

<u>Text Message Service:</u> Get library notices and renew items on you mobile device! Stop at the library to pick up a brochure that fully explains the new service with step-by-step instructions.

<u>Five-Minute Tutorials:</u> Want to refresh your memory about how to renew your books online or order books from other libraries? Ask a library staff member to give you a Five-Minute Hands-On Demo.

<u>Movie Nights:</u> On **Tuesday nights** during the winter the library offers the latest release movies for viewing in the Story Corner. Thanks to the FRIENDS movie license, the library can show the newest releases of popular movies - sometimes the very day they are released. Join us for movies from **4:00 to 6:00**.

<u>Library Closings</u>: The library will be closed on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day. Weather-related closings will be posted on the library website and WJBC website. Library closings typically coincide with public school closings for inclement weather, but not always. Since library opening and closing times differ from the schools, the library **may** be open when the schools are not, or vice versa.

Have a Green Holiday - Reduce and Recycle Holiday Waste

Americans generate literally *tons* of garbage between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. The EAC (Ecology Action Center) encourages residents to try to divert some of it through waste reduction, reuse, recycling, and composting in order to prolong the life of the landfill, conserve natural resources, save energy, and reduce pollution. The Bloomington-Normal community is fortunate to have many excellent recycling programs in place that can help.

Holiday Lights

Strings of lights as well as extension cords can be taken to Morris Tick for recycling! This also might be a great time to invest in the newer LED lights for next year; they will require far less energy than the old fashioned ones. Look for LED lights on sale right after the holidays.

Wrapping Paper and boxes

Most wrapping paper is recyclable (exceptions include any plastic or metallic papers), as well as the boxes. Of course, many gift boxes and gift bags can be saved and used again next year! Recycling drop off locations for paper and cardboard exist in many locations across Normal as well as at Wal-Mart on Market Street or the IWU Shirk Center on Emerson in Bloomington.

Electronics

Did someone get a new computer, phone or electronic game system? Then be sure that the electronics of the recent past don't end up in the landfill. The Town of Normal Public Works Department (1301 Warriner Street, Normal) accepts all kinds of electronics from McLean County residents (no business wastes accepted) for recycling, Monday through Friday from 7 am until 2 pm. Keep those televisions, monitors, broken VCRs, old DVDs, CDs, and more out of the landfill!
