Ecology Action Center to present Radon public information program on October 3, 2012

McLean County has been designated as a zone 2 radon area by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). This means that McLean County homes are at a high risk level for radon concentrations. Radon is a colorless, odorless gas that comes from uranium in the soil and enters homes as a soil gas. It cannot be detected by the senses, and therefore, every home throughout the county and surrounding areas should be tested. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the nation which means that it is a vital concern for this community to address.

In order to prevent the health risks associated with radon, all homes need to be tested. A public information program about radon will be held at *the Normal Public Library on October 3, 2012 from 1-2:30PM and 6-7:30PM in the Community Education Room on the lower level.*

Home radon test kits are available at the Ecology Action Center and will also be available for purchase at this program for \$10.00.

Topics that will be presented to help educate homeowners about radon are:

how it is concentrated in homes
health risks associated with radon and

3.) how to get rid of radon. The public is invited and no pre-registration is required. There is no cost for this event. Attendees will have ample time to ask questions and add comments.
