

# **Indian Creek Property Lines**

The Indian Creek Board asks all residents to be mindful of their own property lines, those of the Indian Creek subdivision, and those of property owners adjacent to the Indian Creek subdivision. Please respect the property of others and do not put yard and leaf waste or other materials on the land of property owners adjacent to Indian Creek.

See maps below for reference.

In limited circumstances, tree branches and brush wood may be brought and thrown up onto the brush pile located in the Indian Creek common area (on Indian Creek property). Do not bring large logs, grass clippings, leaves or other yard waste to the brush pile. If necessary, leaves and grass clippings can be brought to the wooded areas on Indian Creek common property but you must spread them out – do not leave any piles and never dispose of leaves or grass clippings on the walking trails. # **Indian Creek Spring Bird Count**

On Saturday afternoon, May 6<sup>th</sup>, three members of the local National Audubon Society conducted their Spring Bird Count of Indian Creek walking along our trails and common grounds. Below is their checklist from that part of the day. They observed roughly 29 species during the one hour conducting the count. Here are a few of their comments: Good afternoon. Attached are the Spring Bird Count results for the May 6th count in Indian Creek Nature Preserve. It is a beautiful property, and we are always happy to have the opportunity to go birding there each Spring. This year the numbers, both in terms of species and birds were down. For one thing, it was quite windy, and we also got there a bit later than last year. Perhaps both factors made a difference. In total we had 29 species. Next year, I think we'll make a point of going to Indian Creek first.

Nonetheless, it was enjoyable to be there, and once again, thank you!

# Water Hydrant Flushing Schedule - 2023

The six water hydrants located in Indian Creek subdivision will be flushed on the dates listed below. Water hydrants are flushed in order to reduce the build-up of sediments in our water system. This is an important process for improving water quality. Our water operator will flush one hydrant at a time and allow it to run for 10-15 minutes (the next in line hydrant is opened concurrently for a brief period to keep water flowing through the system). Water pressure in our system's lines is maintained by the 35,000 gallons of water in our tower, however, pressure in home lines will be reduced during flushing much like when multiple faucets are opened in your homes. Flushing the hydrants will also stir up sediments so please follow the procedures listed below:

- Do not run water during the flushing time period.
- Following flushing, run water through faucets until clear. We recommend this be done by-passing
  any treatment/filtering system in your home because of the increased sediment stirred up during the
  flushing process.

Please mark your calendars with the dates listed below. Flushing will be done between 5:30 a.m. and 6:30 a.m. weather permitting. **Hydrants will not be flushed in freezing conditions or other inclement weather.**
