Water News

Water Hydrant Flushing Schedule - 2023

The six water hydrants located in Indian Creek subdivision will be flushed on the dates listed below. Water hydrants are flushed in order to reduce the build-up of sediments in our water system. This is an important process for improving water quality. Our water operator will flush one hydrant at a time and allow it to run for 10-15 minutes (the next in line hydrant is opened concurrently for a brief period to keep water flowing through the system). Water pressure in our system's lines is maintained by the 35,000 gallons of water in our tower, however, pressure in home lines will be reduced during flushing much like when multiple faucets are opened in your homes. Flushing the hydrants will also stir up sediments so please follow the procedures listed below:

- Do not run water during the flushing time period.
- Following flushing, run water through faucets until clear. We recommend this be done bypassing any treatment/filtering system in your home because of the increased sediment stirred up during the flushing process.

Please mark your calendars with the dates listed below. Flushing will be done between 5:30 a.m. and 6:30 a.m. weather permitting. Hydrants will not be flushed in freezing conditions or other inclement weather.

Monday, September 25	Monday, November 27
Monday, October 30	Monday, December 18

Water Tower Refurbishing Project

An email was sent to residents on August 20th providing an update on the water tower repair work and refurbishing project. We have not received a revised completion schedule from the contractor, however, it will likely be 5 to 8 weeks before the project is completed.

Temporary Water Usage Restrictions

The pressurized tank used during the refurbishing has less than 1/3rd the capacity of our water tower. *It is critical we do not exceed the capacity of the temporary system in order ensure there are no disruptions in service and avoid boil orders.* Please follow the instructions below and do what you reasonably can to reduce water usage during this period.

Pools - Other than small wading pools, new pools should not be filled during this time. Please use good judgment in topping off existing pools. Topping off late in the evening will reduce stress during high usage hours.

Lawns - We need to further restrict lawn watering from our normal summer guidelines. Lawn watering causes a large spike in summer water usage. Please water no more than twice a week for no more than two hours, only on odd/even days corresponding to your street address number. Please limit this as much as possible to avoid even tighter restrictions. Please also avoid high water usage times in the morning and late afternoon/early evening.




New IC Gate and Refurbished Sign




